Bible bequeathed to Brush's daughter Elizabeth Brush Allen; later kept by Edward Copeland (b. 1795). Bible printed in 1715. Other surname mentioned: Lawrence. Goochland County, Virginia, 1818–1877. Bible of John E. Clarke (b. 1818) and Eliza Browder Jordan Clarke (b. 1819). Bible printed in 1833. Other surnames mentioned: DuVal and Jordan. Transferred from Personal Papers Collection (LVA Acc. 50461). (50501)

**Haase Family.** 2 leaves.

Richmond, Virginia, 1903–1914. Bible of William Frederick Haase (1877–1967) and Mary Copeland Osterbind Haase (1876–1935). Bible printed in 1898. Transferred from Personal Papers Collection (LVA Acc. 50461). (50500)

**Jordan Family.** 4 leaves.

Halifax County and Lynchburg, Virginia, 1834–1904. Bible of Willis Whitfield Jordan (b. 1877), son of William M. Jordan (b. 1834). Includes Bible records (3 leaves) and a looseleaf sheet of paper with the birthdates, 1836–1872, of several individuals listed only by first name (1 leaf). Other surname mentioned: Guthrie. Loaned for duplication by Janet Jordan Perkins, Richmond. (50519)

**Pretlow Family.** 8 leaves.

Chesterfield and Southampton Counties, and Richmond, Virginia, 1847–1951. Bible of Alexander Garrett Pretlow (1847–1912) and Harriet Virginia Whitlock Pretlow (d. 1916). Bible printed in 1874. Other surnames mentioned: Bullington, Cocks, Morton, Parker, Pearson, Ribble, Watts, and Whitlock. Loaned for duplication by Joel Pretlow Cocks, Richmond. (50421)

**Smith Family.** 9 leaves.

Essex County, Virginia, 1810–1937. Bible of William F. Smith (1810–1886). Bible printed in 1848. Includes Bible records (7 leaves) and enclosures (2 leaves). Enclosures consist of an obituary for Lalla R. Smith (d. 1933) and a letter of

recommendation, 19 July 1926, for B. S. Smith from an unnamed church in Hinton, West Virginia. Other surnames mentioned: Dillard, Robinson, and Wright. Gift of Barbara E. Kirk, Center Cross. (50476)

**Austin, Thomas.** 3 pages.

Letter, 29 December 1835, from Thomas Austin (1811–1885) in Buckingham County, Virginia, to his father, Archibald Austin (1772–1837) in Richmond. Topics include slaughtering hogs and their weights and prices, harvesting corn, iron shipments and prices, collecting money for wheat sold, and a request for bacon. Purchased. (50548)

**Basl, Rose Popek.** 42 leaves and 102 pages.

Papers, 1935–1998, of Rose Popek Basl (1919– ) of Hanover County and Petersburg, Virginia, consisting of information on Washington-Henry High School in Hanover County, Christmas poems, a driver's license, a Girl Scout membership card, notes on Czechoslovakia, a song sheet, information on Hanover Town, an ad for fishing rods and tackle, and a business guide and information sheet for Pungo and Sandbridge in Virginia Beach, Virginia. Collection also includes programs for the Washington-Henry High School senior class play, *Man of La Mancha* performed at the Barksdale Theatre, and a performance by pianist Rudolph Firkunsky. Papers also include correspondence, 1988–1998, from Juanice Ford of Redondo Beach, California, and Diane Popek of Czechoslovakia, discussing personal and family news, and reminiscing about Virginia. Most of the collection, however, consists of photographs taken in 1937 of flight training at Pensacola Naval Air Station, as well as images of Miami Beach and the Everglades. **Brown, Jane Margaret.** 3 pages.

Letter, 7 June 1848, from Jane Margaret Brown (ca. 1822–1908) in Cumberland County, Virginia, to her father, Christopher Winfree (1785–1858) in Lynchburg. Topics include attending quarterly meeting in Cartersville, her anticipation of him visiting in summer, and plans to visit him in Lynchburg and brother Christopher Valentine Winfree (1826–1902), who was attending the Virginia Military Institute, if he did not come to see her family. Brown also writes about deaths in the area, the health of friends and relatives, and other family news. Purchased. (50551)

**Cowdery-Taylor Family.** 12 leaves.

Papers, 1853–1948, of the Cowdery and Taylor families of Norfolk, Virginia, and Massachusetts, including correspondence, genealogical notes, slave sale receipt, circular, photograph, greeting cards, and other items. Purchased. (50561)

**Dailey Family.** 20 leaves and 3 pages.

Papers, 1832–1950, of the Dailey family of Loudoun County and Radford, Virginia, containing pension papers, 23 October 1832, and two copies of the will, 31 October 1845 and proved 12 November 1845, of Jesse Dailey (1760–1845) of Loudoun County; declaration, 5 February 1846, of Polly Dailey (1765–1853), widow of Jesse Dailey; deed, 25 September 1911 and recorded 17 October 1911, for two lots in Radford from Mellie Sublett of Wingo County, West Virginia, to Martha Daily (1876–1952) of Radford; and photographs, 1937 and 1950, of the Daily family of Radford. **Doumlele, John Antony.** 110 leaves and 4 pages.

Papers, 1941–1953, of John Antony Doumlele (1916–2008) of Richmond, Virginia, relating to his service in the United States Naval Reserve, specifically aboard the USS *Bullfinch*, USS *Broadbill*, USS *Fierce*, and at the Naval Air Gunners School in Miami, during World War II. Includes appointments, clippings, correspondence, maps, orders, photographs, separation and discharge papers, service record, and telegrams. Loaned for duplication by Ruth Doumlele, Midlothian. Papers, 1821–1906, of the Dulany family of Loudoun County, Virginia, containing original and transcript of the diary, 1821 and 1847, of Mary Ann de Butts Dulany (1786–1855) detailing her personal life; originals and transcripts of letters, 1861–1865, to and from John Peyton Dulany (1787–1878) concerning the effects of the Civil War on him and his family, including male relatives serving in the Confederate Army; and genealogical information on the Dulany and Whiting families. **Edmunds, Allen Telford.** 1.32 cubic feet.

Papers, 1917–2000, of Allen Telford Edmunds (1903–1985) of Michigan and Richmond, Virginia, consisting of biographical information on Edmunds; correspondence; family budgets; Edmunds' travelogues; secondary, high school, and college diplomas; accounts of his work in the National Park Service (NPS); reports on

NPS projects he worked on along the Great Lakes and the Atlantic Coast; scrapbook and brochures from his participation in the World Recreation Congress in Japan and Taiwan in 1964; professional certificates and awards; college yearbook; and other papers. Gift of James and Harriet Edmunds, Kill Devil Hills, North Carolina. (43432)

**Farrar, Joseph C.** 2 pages.

Letter, 16 October 1850, from Joseph C. Farrar (ca. 1812–1878) in South Hill, Mecklenburg County, Virginia, to his daughter Maria E. Farrar (1836–1912), while she was attending the Warrenton Female Institute. Subjects include the departure of Reverend Philip Slaughter (1808–1890), visits with friends, including her former teacher Nancy Henderson Hubbard (1823–1863), health, and family news. Purchased. **Gatewood, Mary A.** 4 pages.

Letter, 21 November 1843, from Mary A. Gatewood (b. ca. 1812) at “Ellerslie” in Caroline County, Virginia, to her sister Cassandra Oliver (ca. 1818–1904) in Richmond. Topics include housekeeping, visits with family and friends and comments about their health, weddings in the area, attending church services and Bible class at Carmel Church, rumors of church members leaving the congregation, and extending an invitation to visit. Purchased. (50550)

**Geschwind, Mary L.** 20.7 cubic feet.

Papers, 1845–2006, of Mary Looper Geschwind (b. 1932) of Richmond, Virginia, containing genealogical research files and personal papers of the Osterbind, Haase, Looper, and Geschwind families of Richmond, Virginia; Mississippi and South Carolina; and Germany and Russia. The collection includes abstracts and transcriptions of church and court records, accounts and receipts, artwork, brochures, class notes, clippings, correspondence, estate administration records, family group sheets, genealogical notes and charts, greeting cards, invitations, obituaries, pedigree charts, photographs, postcards, programs, published sources, sheet music, sympathy cards and notes, tombstone inscriptions, and yearbooks. **Hunter, David.** 1 leaf and 2 pages.

Survey papers, 1796–1797, for surveys recorded by David Hunter (1761–1829) of Berkeley County, (West) Virginia, for tracts of land for Robert Gustin, Elisha Boyd, George Everhart, John Hearting, Thomas Thatcher, Jonathan Thatcher, and Joseph Hedges. Transferred from State Records Collection, Library of Virginia, Richmond. (50388)

**Montague, Robert Lynch.** 6.825 cubic feet.

Papers, 1882–1914, of Robert Lynch Montague (1864–1932) of Richmond, Virginia, containing his legal and political correspondence. Legal correspondence concerns cases and matters upon which he worked and political correspondence covers Virginia and national politics, specifically the political career of his brother Andrew Jackson Montague (1862–1937), governor of Virginia and congressman. Collection contains some correspondence of Andrew Jackson Montague. Collection also includes a

volume of Robert Lynch Montague's legal notes. Gift of Elizabeth Hoskins Montague of Richmond. (22001a)

**Parker, Richard.** 4 pages.

Statement, 24 April 1777, of Richard Parker (1729–1813) of Westmoreland County, Virginia, defending Richard Henry Lee (1732–1794) and himself from accusations of plans to depreciate the paper currency issued by Virginia during the Revolution. Parker refutes claims that Lee refused to accept paper money in rent payment for his property in Fauquier County, Virginia, in order to drive down the value of paper money. Parker includes a poem entitled "The Three Black Crows." Transferred from State Records Collection, Library of Virginia, Richmond. (50124)

**Peery, George C.** 1 volume.

Diary, 1936, of George C. Peery (1873–1952), governor of Virginia, detailing his daily activities during the year and discussing the General Assembly sessions, including an extra session; appointments; engagements; conferences; meetings; and personal activities. Peery also comments on political activities, including the Democratic National Convention and the election; legislation, including old age pension, tobacco control, and unemployment insurance; and the weather. Gift of Betsy Blizzard McClearn, Salem. (50386)

**Pickett, Martin.** 1 leaf, digital scan.

Land grant, 26 December 1792, to Martin Pickett (1736–1804) of Fauquier County, Virginia, for 139 acres on Marsh and Marrs Run. Loaned for duplication by William C. Stribling, Markham. (50571)

**Pleasants, Rosalie Harrison.** 1 volume.

Diary, 1 January–9 May 1893, of Rosalie Harrison Pleasants (1864–1945) of Richmond, Virginia, detailing her social life and interactions with prominent Richmond families. She describes visits to Brook Hill, home of the Stewart family, and homes of other prominent Richmond families, attending church services and weddings, and comments on social life. Pleasants also discusses her fiancé William Wharton Archer (1854–1928). Diary also contains a brief almanac for 1893. Gift of Renee Savits, Henrico. (50498)

**Riley, John.** 2 leaves, digital scans.

Deed, 3 November 1787, from Denny Martin Fairfax (1725–1800) to John Riley (1748–1820) of Fauquier County, Virginia, for 160 acres. The deed includes notations concerning its transfer to various owners until 1837. Loaned for duplication by William C. Stribling, Markham. (50514)

**Scott, W. W.** 17 leaves and 10 pages.

Papers, 1900–1957, of W. W. Scott (1845–1929) including correspondence of his son Philip H. Scott (1873–1962) with historians regarding James Madison (1751–1836). Collection added to W. W. Scott papers, 1891–1924 (LVA Acc. 44929). Gift of Ann Thornton, New York, New York. (50464)

**Smith, H. Cornelia.** 3 pages.

Letter, 12 June [1849?], from H. Cornelia Smith (b. 1828) at Greenwood Seminary in Dinwiddie County, Virginia, to Nancy Henderson Hubbard (1823–1863) in Mecklenburg County. Subjects include her teaching responsibilities, living in the home of William R. Buford (1813–1850), and her opinions of Southern students as compared to those in the North. Purchased. (50552)

**Smith, Rufus A.** 48 pages.

Letters, 6 March 1864–31 May 1865, from Rufus A. Smith (1841–1923), while he was serving with the 1st Maine Cavalry, to his parents in Biddeford, York County, Maine. Topics include descriptions of the destruction in Virginia, weather, reasons for not coming home, sending clothes and money, fighting near Harrison's Landing in Charles City County, Virginia, recovering in a hospital from wounds suffered in battles at St. Mary's Church and Boydton Plank Road, mail deliveries, inquiries about news from home, Confederate deserters, being stationed at Chesterfield Courthouse to keep order following the war, surrender of Confederate forces west of the Mississippi River, and his impending discharge from his unit. Purchased. (50546)

**Stratton, James Sherwin.** 12 pages.

Letters, 1863, of James Sherwin Stratton (1843–1864) while he was serving with the 12th New Jersey Infantry in Fauquier County, Virginia, to his father, Nathan Taylor Stratton (1813–1887) in Gloucester County, New Jersey. Topics include camp life, promotions within his unit, court martial of Lieutenant Theodore F. Null, inquiries about the draft and the possibility of transferring to a cavalry unit, pessimism about surviving the war, attending church services and hearing a speech by General Joshua T. Owen (1821–1887), reports and rumors of Confederate troop movements, plans to recapture Union gunboats near Fredericksburg, mail deliveries, destruction of the Orange and Alexandria Railroad, and the weather. Purchased. (50545)

**Thornton, William Compton.** 4 pages.

Letter, 27 October 1818, from William Compton Thornton of Richmond, Virginia, to his cousin Townsend Compton (1778–1834) of London, England, discussing the possibility of war between the United States and Great Britain over the execution of Alexander Arbuthnot (1784–1818) and Robert Ambrister (1797–1818) in Florida; a duel between Oliver Hazard Perry and John Heath; a hanging in Richmond; and other news. Purchased. (50475)

**Unidentified.** 23 pages.

Miscellaneous religious tracts consisting of *Life's Supreme Adventure* by Walter Calley (b. 1858) and *Notes on Ephesians* by James H. McConkey (1858–1937). Transferred from State Records Collection, Library of Virginia, Richmond. (50369)

**Wiley, H. A.** 4 pages.

Letter, 21–22 November 1862 from H. A. Wiley (b. ca. 1836) of Company B, 104 New York Regiment, to his brother Robert (b. ca. 1830) and his father John (b. ca. 1794) of Livingston County, New York, describing the muddy roads in Stafford County,

Virginia, noting that the Confederate army fired artillery into his corps' encampment, and discussing army life in general. Wiley also asks for money and for letters from home. Purchased. (50544)

**Will Family.** 5 leaves and 4 pages.

Papers, 1826–1861, of the Will family of Shenandoah County, Virginia, consisting of a typescript of a letter, 1 August 1826, from Adam Mueller to Adam Will concerning Mueller's preaching and teaching; an agreement, 17 July 1833, between John Will and Robert Allen swapping land in Shenandoah and Botetourt Counties, Virginia; a receipt, 7 December 1848, for goods bought and sold from Philip A. Will to Baker and Brown of Winchester, Virginia; and a letter, 22 April 1861, from Dillman Will to his brother encouraging him to join the army. Gift of Cornelia Kibler, Strasburg. (50462)
