Scrapbooks, 1951–1983, of the Business and Professional Women's Club of Richmond, Virginia, including annual reports, biographical sketches of board members, booklets, brochures, certificates, clippings, constitution and by-laws, correspondence, ephemera, financial records, meeting and convention materials, newsletters, photographs, programs, reports, resolutions, summaries of local, district, state, and national activities, and yearbooks. Virginia Chapter of the National Organization for Women. 11.35 cubic feet.

Records, 1971–2004, 2011, of the Virginia Chapter of the National Organization for Women include subject files on abortion and the Equal Rights Amendment, various administrative and general files, papers collected on numerous issues of interest to the organization, Virginia NOW Political Action Committee files, newsletters, local chapter files, and audiovisual materials. Many records of the national organization are found amongst these papers. Also included are records from the Texas Chapter, donated by Frances M. Allison, Annye Lewis. 1 volume (66 p.).

Scrapbook, 1906–1934, of Annye Lewis Allison (1878–1943) of Richmond, Virginia, containing clippings, poetry, programs, and recipes. Purchased. (45004)

Aull, Margaret Burroughs. 12 cubic feet.

Papers, 1883–2006, of Margaret Burroughs Aull (1918–2011) of Borger, Hutchinson County, Texas, containing genealogical research files on the Burroughs family, and the allied families of Aull, Bondurant, Booth, Cocke, Faure, Foose, Ford, Hayter, Hon, Maxey, Parker, Pierce, and Thaxton, including lines that settled in Amelia, Bedford, Buckingham, Franklin, Goochland, and Henrico Counties, Virginia; and Iowa, Illinois, Kentucky, Missouri, Ohio, and Texas. There is also information on Aull's ancestor, James Burroughs (1794–1861) and his plantation, where Booker T. Washington (1856–1913) was born into slavery. In addition, the collection contains files related to Aull's involvement in various hereditary and patriotic organizations. Gift of Margaret Burroughs Aull, Amarillo, Texas. (42691)

Baldwin, Frank Vernon. .45 cubic feet.

Papers, 1919–1950, of Frank Vernon Baldwin (1866–1956) of New York City, containing genealogical research on the Baldwin family, which settled in Amelia,

Dinwiddie, Isle of Wight, Nottoway, and Prince Edward Counties, Virginia. There is also information on the allied families of Fowlkes, Jennings, and Walton. The collection includes applications to hereditary and patriotic organizations, compilations by other researchers, correspondence with family members and others, and pedigrees. Gift of Robert H. Basl family. .9 cubic feet

Papers, 1962–1990, of James J. Basl of Chesterfield County and Petersburg and Richmond, Virginia, consisting of compositions, diaries, essays, exams, poems, programs, reports, stories, and other papers from Basl's time as a student in the Petersburg Public School system and as a student at the University of Virginia. Papers highlight his interests in literature, history, sociology, and computers, and contain essays, stories, and poems written by Basl while a student. Diaries include descriptions of his stays at Seashore State Park (now First Landing State Park); papers also cover his extracurricular activities in campus politics at U.Va. and his work in the banking industry. Benton-Harrison Family. 19 leaves, digital scans.

Papers, 1773–1858, of the Benton and Harrison families of Fairfax and Loudoun Counties, Virginia, including an account, correspondence, deeds, slave sale receipt, and land survey. Loaned for copying by Anna Lee Jeffery Peterson and Kathy Lynn Monroe Coffey, Frederick, Maryland. (50806)

Davis, Courtland Harwell, Sr. .45 cubic feet.

Historical Title Devolution of the Northern Neck of Virginia, compiled in 1970 by Courtland Harwell Davis, Sr. (1897–1992), tracing the title of the Northern Neck grant, incorporating extracts from Virginia and United States Supreme Court decisions, Hening's Statutes at Large, published sources, and patent and grant records at the Library of Virginia. Included are transcriptions of patents, grants, and wills, as well as an appendix with an explanation of the head-right system and quit rents, lists of English monarchs, Virginia governors, and proprietary agents, chronologies, certain court decisions and Acts of Assembly, and other information. Durham, Charles Emory. .675 cubic feet.

Letters, 1940–1965, written to Charles Emory Durham (1912–2009) of Tappahannock, Essex County, Virginia, immediately following the end of World War II before he was shipped home, and afterwards, while he was living in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Topics include courtship, marriage, employment, news of mutual friends and acquaintances, and social activities. Purchased. (50890)

Foster, Talmage DeWitte. 3.325 cubic feet.

Papers, 1925–1950, of Talmage DeWitte Foster (1896–1960), relating to his duties as superintendent of schools for Sussex County, Virginia. Includes correspondence, lists of teachers, publications, school enrollment reports, and teacher applications. Purchased. (50869) **RESTRICTED**

Hallett, William A., Jr. .175 cubic feet.

Letters, 1946–1947, from William A. Hallett, Jr. (1926–2012), while he was serving in the offices of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in Tokyo during the occupation of Japan, to his parents in Cheriton, Northampton County, Virginia. Purchased. (50810)

Hankins, Edith Jackson. 1.35 cubic feet.

Papers, 1983–2011, of Edith Jackson Hankins (b. 1930) of Jasper, Walker County, Alabama, containing genealogical research on her ancestors who settled in Albemarle, Chesterfield, King George, Lunenburg, and Westmoreland Counties, Virginia; and Illinois, Kentucky, North Carolina, and Tennessee. The collection includes correspondence, and copies and transcriptions of census records, deed books, marriage records, order books, tax lists, wills, and published histories. There is a large amount of information on the Belcher, Bourland, Burpo, Earle, and Rudd families. Gift of Edith Jackson Hankins, Jasper, Alabama. (50266)

Holcomb, George Brauning. .1 cubic feet.

Newspaper columns, 1986–1998, written by George Brauning Holcomb (1924–2010) of Arlington and Prince William County, Virginia, that appeared in the *Washington Inquirer* under the pseudonym Jonathan T. Stride. Most of the articles concern Cuban and Nicaraguan politics and relations with the United States. Gift of Dirk B. Holcomb, Richmond. (50824)

Jackson, Joe. 3.375 cubic feet.

Papers, 1984–1999, of Joe Jackson (b. 1955) of Virginia Beach, relating to his research and co-authorship of *Dead Run: The Untold Story of Dennis Stockton and America's Only Mass Escape from Death Row*, published in 1999. The book details the case of death row inmate Dennis Stockton (1940–1995), as well as the escape of six fellow inmates at the Mecklenburg Correctional Center on 31 May 1984. The collection includes clippings, correspondence, drafts, galleys and a copy of the book, notes, and legal documents, as well as writings of Stockton while he was a prisoner on death row at the Powhatan Correctional Center and the Mecklenburg Correctional Center. Keller, Leroy A. .175 cubic feet.

Papers, 1934–1985, of Leroy A. Keller (1916–2000) of Nottoway County and Richmond, Virginia, relating to his service with the 69th Infantry Division during World War II. The collection includes biographical information, discharge papers, poetry, photographs, and reunion materials. Gift of Leroy A. Keller, Jr., Glen Allen. (45552)

Maben, Edward T. .225 cubic feet.

Papers, 1926–1976, of Edward T. Maben (1906–1977) of Blackstone, Nottoway County, Virginia. The bulk of the collection covers the years 1942–1946, while Maben was serving in various Signal Corps units in England during World War II, and includes correspondence, orders, reports, and photographs. There is also a National Guard discharge, 1926, and information on the renovation and restoration of a multi-building

complex at Hampden-Sydney College, 1976, while Maben was serving on the Board of Trustees. Gift of Jennie S. Howe, Gloucester Point. (50804)

Marshall, Edward C. 1 reel of microfilm. (*Misc. reel 6127*)

Papers, 1868–1931, of Edward C. Marshall (1842–1912) of Fauquier County, Virginia. There are two ledgers and a memorandum book. They contain accounts of individuals for work performed on Marshall's farm "Millway," including wages paid for plowing, harvesting, hauling, washing, and other tasks, as well as house rents, interest payments, and taxes paid by the workers, and for wood, corn, flour and other items purchased by them. The memorandum book also notes amounts drawn on various banks. There is a name index at the beginning of each volume. Lent for microfilming by William Stribling, Markham. (50582)

Sisisky, Norman. .35 cubic feet.

Papers, 1999–2000, of Norman Sisisky (1927–2001), consisting of requests for add-ons to the defense budget while he was serving as ranking member of the House Armed Services Committee Subcommittee on Military Procurement. This accession is filed as Box 11a with Accession 40776. Gift of Perry Floyd, Falls Church. (50791)

Wulfeck, Dorothy Ford. 1.35 cubic feet.

Papers, 1955–1977, of Dorothy Ford Wulfeck (1897–1983) of Naugatuck, New Haven County, Connecticut, containing genealogical research on her ancestors, information compiled while she was editor of a genealogy column in the *Virginia Gazette*, and materials relating to numerous publications, including *Wilcoxson and Allied Families* (1958), *Virginia Settlers in Missouri* (1964), and *Smith of Virginia* (1966, 1969). There is information on the Boone, Calloway, Hansbrough, Hatton, Hawkins, Haydon, Holman, Moss, Smith, Tatum, Whitaker, Wilcoxson, and Wilson families and allied lines that settled in Culpeper, Essex, Fauquier, Gloucester, King George, Spotsylvania, and Stafford Counties, Virginia; and Kentucky and Missouri. The collection contains abstracts and transcriptions of census records, land patents and grants, parish registers, published sources, vital statistics, and wills, as well as correspondence with other researchers, family group sheets, genealogical charts, pedigrees, and notebooks.
