

**Richmond Times-Dispatch, *Students Will Hold Forum on Jackson Case,*  
October 12, 1935**

University Men Sponsor  
Discussion of Negro  
Girl's Admission

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Oct. 12—

University of Virginia student members of the National Students League will sponsor an open forum discussion Sunday night of the case of Alice Jackson, colored, of Richmond, whose application for admission to the graduate department of the university was rejected by the governing board of visitors.

The student organization, said to stand for "equal rights for all," has arranged for the appearance of a representative of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. The meeting is scheduled for Madison Hall, headquarters of the student union and the university's Young Men's Christian Association.

Dean Ivy F. Lewis was requested to uphold the university's position in the case at Sunday's meeting, but refused, saying that he did not wish to elaborate the school's viewpoint before the matter was definitely settled.

Last week the university chapter of the National Students League sent a letter to the board of visitors severely criticizing the action in refusing to admit the Jackson girl on racial grounds.
